December Membership Meeting

Monday, **December 13 at 7:00 pm** is our next Quarterly Membership Meeting. This is an important meeting as it is **our last chance** to propose any suggested amendments to our club by-laws. Suggested by-law changes <u>must be submitted in writing</u> to any board member. They will then be reviewed by the by-law committee to ensure they don't affect or conflict with other sections of the by-laws before presenting them for full review.

You can also propose, submit recommendations, or volunteer for any Club Officers or District Director positions at this meeting for the 2022-23 membership year. Elections for these positions occur at the next quarterly meeting, which is also the **Annual Membership Meeting on March 14, 2022** along with our wild game chili cook-off, and voting on any submitted by-law changes.

The board is also considering an increase in **membership dues** to support ongoing club and range improvements. As the Wink Trust CD has now been exhausted with the completion of the indoor restroom facilities, there are no more funds to draw from for these types of club improvements beyond our normal operating budget. The annual dues have not been increased from \$75 for well over a decade although all costs have increased over time. (*The only exception was the implementation of an initial, one-time, new member orientation fee of* \$25.)

The board of directors would like member input on any dues increase, which must be discussed and voted on by the board at 2 board meetings per our club by-laws. The December BOD meeting would be the second such meeting. You may discuss this issue with the board during the December membership meeting to ask questions or give your input. You may also contact any board member to express your thoughts, especially your District Director who is elected by you to represent you. Contact numbers for all board members are listed on page 3 of this newsletter. Also remember, members may attend any and all board meetings, you just don't have voting privileges at BOD meeting, just membership meetings. The board serves the membership and needs your input to properly run our club.

We had a decent turnout of members during firearm deer season's sight-in days on the rifle range. Our club provided volunteer Range Safety Officers (RSO) for help and monitoring during this time. Some RSO's noticed a few less-than-optimal firearm handling practices and offered their assistance to correct these potential deadly safety concerns.

Mainly some individuals were handling their firearm while others were downrange. This is a definite NO. The rule is absolutely **NO HANDLING** of any firearm while anyone is downrange for any reason. Coordination and cooperation is the key here.

Also some people were caught swinging their (unloaded) firearm muzzle in front of others. This also is always a huge NO-NO! We must always be cognizant of where others are and where our firearm is pointed. Remember NEVER POINT A FIREARM at a person! Always keep your firearm pointed in a safe direction.

We must all be aware of others at all times while at the range. Let's keep it safe for everyone.

Walt Zablocki Wins 2021 Fall Trap League



The winner of this year's Fall Trap League was Walter Zablocki, who hit 358 out of 400 total targets for a score of 89.5%. Our Runner Up was Jim Perlberg with 84.5% (338/400), and the Third Place winner was Karen Perlberg with a score of 83.5% (334/400). This year had lower turnout than normal and we attributed this to the hardship of obtaining ammunition plus the cost if you did find any. We had some drop out due to various reasons as well. We will start up the Winter League in January with corresponding BIG 50's again. Hopefully we'll have a better turnout and get more than one Lewis class (which means more winners!).

Winter Trap League Jan 9 to Feb 27

This year's **Winter Trap League** will run from 1/9/22 to 2/27/22. It will be **SIN-GLES ONLY** with the "**OPTION to REGISTER**" your targets as a **Big 50** each week, <u>if enough people are interested.</u> We need 3 people to hold a registered event. It will be an 8-week league with 8 of the weeks scores to count, *unless the participants collectively choose less due to weather, etc.* There is a possibility to make-up missed rounds on Tuesdays by appointment. Each week will be 50 targets (2 rounds). Shoot can be modified if agreed upon by participants. This, of course, is all dependent on any prohibitions on gatherings.

Both registered and non-registered shooters may shoot the league and may even shoot on the same squads. Plus open Trap will continue concurrently with these events. We will need at least 3 shooters to shoot registered for the Big 50 to count that week. And you don't have to shoot registered every week. This must be decided by the shooter before shooting that week, but it's a good way to get your ATA targets in. Youth shooters are also very welcome to participate!

The appropriate reduced fees will apply to those wishing to register their targets with the ATA. The cost will be \$20 for the league pot of money, plus each week's shoot fees (targets), and the ATA & MTA reduced daily fees *if shooting registered for that week*. Reduced fees are half of normal daily & MTA target assessment fees and are \$4 (*unless changed by ATA or MTA*).
