Steel Targets on Rifle & Pistol Ranges

As you may have noticed, we have been making efforts to add some steel "gong" targets on the rifle and pistol ranges. I need your help to make sure the use of steel targets remains a success! The occasional "torn strap" or "broken chain" happens. I've planned for it and budgeted for it. It's normal maintenance stuff--please just do your best to keep it to a minimum!

On the pistol range with movable targets, you can help keep the damage to a minimum by being aware what is behind your targets as you move them around, so your shots don't impact the legs or chains of the steel targets. (Reminder: Steel targets should be no closer than 30 feet to reduce potential injury from bullet splatter)

Where I really need your help is to make sure we're all using the proper ammo and calibers for the steel gongs. The gongs themselves are expensive to replace (and they're heavy!!). The gongs on the Pistol range are suitable for **LEAD CORE BULLETS** in all common and magnum pistol calibers, including AR/AK-Style pistols in 5.56, 7.62x39, 300 Blackout, etc. and the magnum revolver calibers up to the .500 Smith & Wesson.

The gongs on the Rifle range are suitable for <u>LEAD CORE BULLETS</u> in all common and magnum rifle calibers, muzzleloaders, and shotgun slugs--up to the 338 Lapua and the African magnums.

- Heavy magnum rifles such as 50 BMG, 408 CheyTac, 416 Barrett, etc. will break the gongs, even with lead core bullets. **DO NOT USE!**
- Steel core bullets and/or "armor piercing" bullets in any rifle or pistol caliber will damage or break the gongs. **DO NOT USE!**
- Dangerous Game Solids will break the gongs. **DO NOT USE!** (*Note: Lead-Free bullets that are designed to mushroom, like the Barnes TTSX and similar, are OK to use on the gongs.*)

Any steel target will wear out over time due to normal use and metal fatigue, but we all should work to make sure we don't have premature failures. We've had 4 or 5 gongs get broken in the last 2 years. I don't want to spend the range budget to replace broken gongs, I want to spend the range budget to add more!

Shotgun "Iron Man" Match Set for October 4

The Club is holding its friendly **Annual Shotgun "Iron Man"** (or Iron Woman) Match on Sunday October 4 at 12:30 pm (or when morning open trap & skeet shooting is done, which ever is later). This event will consist of shooting one round of skeet, one standard 16-yard trap round, one round of **WOBBLE Trap**, and one 5-Stand Sporting Clays round for a total of 100 rounds. You may use the same or different guns for the different events, but there is no handicapping if using gauges smaller than 12 gauge. Standard target loads of 7.5, 8, or 9 shot sizes allowed. No heavy loads to keep it fair. Accolades and a trophy plus money for the Best-of-the Best "All Around" Combined Shotgunner. Who's in? Cost is \$25 and includes 1 round each of skeet, trap, wobble trap, and 5-stand. Open to Club members and non-members. Youth are welcome. A Hot Dog lunch is planned. ATA "Leather Shoot" - October 11

Our next ATA trap shoot is set for Sunday, October 11. This is our **National Trapshooting Day** shoot with **Shamrock Leather** and other trophies for the winners. Covid 19 rules will be followed. Breakfast and lunch are planned as "Take Out".

It is a 3-Event shoot with a 100-Singles Event followed by 100 Handicap and 100 Doubles targets events. You can shoot 1 event, 2 events, or all three. There is a High Over All winner for the best combined score of these 3 events. The HOA is a very nice leather shooting bag.

As the new ATA season has started in September, you will need to renew your ATA membership at this shoot unless you have already renewed with the ATA.

Fall Lewis Class Trap League Oct 18 to Dec 13

This year's **Fall Trap League** will be **SINGLES ONLY** with the "**OPTION to REGISTER**" your targets as an **ATA Big 50** each week. It will be a 8-week league; 50 targets (2 rounds) each week. Both registered and non-registered may shoot the league and may even shoot on the same squads. We will need at least 3 shooters to shoot registered for the Big 50 to count that week. You don't have to shoot registered every week either. This must be decided by the shooter before shooting that week, but it's a good way to get your ATA targets in. The appropriate reduced fees will apply to those wishing to register their targets with the ATA. The cost will be \$20 for the league pot of money, plus each week's shoot fees (targets), and the ATA & MTA reduced daily fees *if shooting registered for that week*. Reduced fees are half of normal daily & MTA target assessment fees.
